DISASTER PLANNING BEFORE IT HAPPENS

TIPS/LESSONS LEARNED - BEFORE A DISASTER

- TIP The essential operations of your community MUST be considered prior to a disaster. These could include;
 - Open communication platforms for vital community representatives
 - Restoration of utilities including additional utility representative contacts with the ability to establish outside agreements in a situation of need
 - Standby water pumps and where the water pumps will most likely be needed depending on structures and locations


TIPS/LESSONS LEARNED - AFTER A DISASTER

- TIP Understand your localities ability to perform Program Administration for CDBG-DR funds.
- These task can include but are not limited to;
 - Overseeing contractor selection
 - Reporting to HUD
 - > Tracking activities and Expenditures
 - Managing communications between the state, the stake holders, and the community
 - Ensuring all activities are COMPLIANT AND REIMBURSABLE
