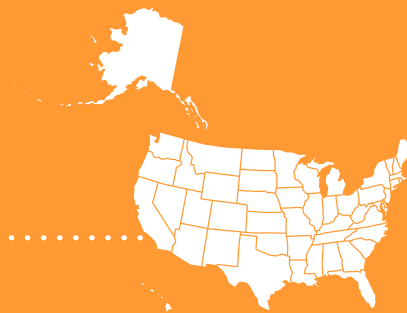


ADDRESSING MENTAL ILLNESS AND MEDICAL CONDITIONS IN COUNTY JAILS

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The jail population has complex healthcare needs.

64% OF JAIL INMATES HAVE A MENTAL ILLNESS



40% OF JAIL INMATES HAVE A CHRONIC MEDICAL CONDITION



Inmate healthcare, medication and hospital stays are significant cost drivers for counties.

40% OF JAIL INMATES WITH A CHRONIC MEDICAL CONDITION USE PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION



Connecting the jail population that has a medical condition or mental illness to the type of treatment they need is a pressing issue.

22% OF COUNTY JAILS HAVE A COMMUNITY BASED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH TREATMENT AND SUPERVISION PROGRAM



Collaboration between the county justice system, health providers and other community based organizations is essential to the success of treatment programs and for meeting the immediate and long term health needs of those with behavioral health or medical conditions who come into contact with the county jail.
