#### 10:20 AM: Security & Privacy Essentials for CIOs, County Leaders and Elected Officials

*This presentation is for CIOs, local government leaders and elected officials who are interested in changing the culture of their organization and awareness of cyber security. It is a use case describing a back-to-basics approach codenamed "Door-to-Door Security & Privacy Essentials" used by Tarrant County Texas to educate its employees achieving a level of success better than anything we expected.*

*Changing County culture or behavior with respect to Cybersecurity happens slowly and requires time, patience, support and commitment. Support and commitment from the top (CIO, leaders and elected officials) is crucial for success, but so is the need for buy-in by employees at all levels. Our program execution focused on a few core principles. People are interested in themselves first! What is in it for me? And with that in mind, we focus first on "personal or home cyber security risk exposure". This grabs everyone's attention, then we incrementally work participants to its workplace application, borrowing from the idea that "You'd rather they remember a little than forget a lot", etc.*

*Information Security is a shared responsibility and we need everyone's help. Participants in this session will learn more about our approach, what we did so well, lessons we learned and most importantly, will walk away with nuggets they may immediately replicate back in your own organizations.*
