#### Reasonable Expectation

 An expectation of conduct arising from a promise explicitly made or implied by our conduct



### Reasonable Expectation and Promises

- Promises create a reasonable expectation,
- Promises also acknowledge a reasonable expectation
- Promises create duties to fulfill the promises.
- Integrity is the fulfillment of duties




#### Duty

 Fulfilling a reasonable expectation of another person or community of persons.



### The process of fulfilling promises



#### Discernment

 A deliberative process in which all applicable right things, or duties, are identified.



 Visiting New York City, you see a street vendor selling designer label suits at a fraction of what you know to be the retail cost, and you buy one.

 You are on the road a lot, driving long stretches of highway with few cars around.
You have an excellent driving record and you just don't see the harm in texting, and you do so.

You listen to public TV or public radio without contributing

 You walk into Starbucks, get your coffee and sit down at a table, purposely spreading out your belongings so that no one will sit down next to you.

#### **Duty of Civility**

 Civility is the gesture we make to demonstrate our willingness to interact with others for mutual well being and the common good.
