










#### LOST VALLEY RESERVOIR - DISPERSED CAMPSITES

### Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program Overview

Congress established the Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program (CFLRP) with Title IV of the Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009 (PDF, 40 KB).

The purpose of the Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program is to encourage the collaborative, science-based ecosystem restoration of priority forest landscapes.

Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack articulated his vision for America's Forests in a speech given in Seattle in August 2009. The Secretary underscored the overriding importance of forest restoration by calling for complete commitment to restoration. In this same speech, the Secretary highlighted the need for pursuing an all lands approach to forest restoration and called for close coordination with other landowners to encourage collaborative solutions through landscape-scale operations. The Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program provides a means to achieve these aims and to also:

- encourage ecological, economic, and social sustainability;
- leverage local resources with national and private resources;
- facilitate the reduction of wildfire management costs, including through re-establishing natural fire regimes and reducing the risk of

The Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation and the Woody Biomass Utilization Partnership convened the first meeting of the Payette Forest Coalition (PFC) in June 2009. 











Road Decommissioning – Before and After
