

Procurement Process

- RFP developed in collaboration with the NACo Procurement Advisory
 Committee
- Federal funding requirements included
- Nationally advertised RFP#24-6814 issued February 16, 2024
- Asking for a comprehensive product, service and solution proposals
- Pre-proposal conference February 26, 2024 at 2 PM
- RFP closed on March 21, 2024 at 12 PM with two responses



Procurement Process

- Proposals were evaluated by subject matter experts from Cobb County and procurement professionals from Franklin County, Ohio, and Douglas County, Neb
- Cobb County's Board approved the contract award to Safeware, Inc.
 on June 11, 2024

- Effective July 1, 2024 June 30, 2028 with three renewal option years through June 30, 3031




