### What our team has focused on since the NACo Creative Placemaking Challenge:

- Met monthly to continue the conversation of what creative placemaking looks like in our community
- Increased our team to include more stakeholders:
  - o CEO, Chamber of Commerce
  - VP, Community & Alumni Relations, SUU
  - o ED, Tourism Bureau
- Integrated our work into Vision 2050:
  - Involved in their focus groups, surveys, and steering committee
  - Attended the Conservation Fund's "Balancing Nature & Commerce" conference

#### What we have identified as benchmark goals by addressing the following issues:

- Identify zoning laws or public policies that need to change now in order for us to accomplish our goals later [in progress]
- Work to better our streets with lighting, wider sidewalks, benches, landscaping, parking, etc.
- Form a city/county Public Art Committee to create long-term plan for public art [people have been identified]
- Expand the Cedar City Arts Council's Final Friday Art
   Walk from 4 months to 6 months [will begin in 2020]
- Create an Arts & Culture Master Plan for Iron County, beginning with Cedar City



  - Art installation Complete (July 2019)









