

Over the past 10 years the agency has become a national leader in the 2-Generation Approach (2-G), a practice model that works to realize the aspirations of those they serve while creating greater family economic security. The agency has transformed its corporate culture, become more outcome oriented, and has developed proprietary client tracking software (EmpowOR) which is sold nationwide.
