U.S. Forest Service Region 1 includes 25 million acres of land within 12 national forests and grasslands in five states, including Montana. Region 1 includes the second largest wilderness area in the United States as well as numerous active vegetation management projects. Regional Forester Leanne Martin discussed efforts to improve landscape and watershed quality and how the Forest Service is working with intergovernmental partners to reduce fuel loads and grow rural economies.

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) manages over 248.3 million acres of land and roughly 700 million acres of subsurface minerals nationwide. State and local officials play a key role in helping the agency to meet its multiple-use mission. Nada Culver, Acting Director of the BLM, updated the Board on resource development policies, wildlife management, and the new administration's efforts to engage with counties.
