

CODE OF PRACTICE


As an extension of our NACo values, we are **guided by a shared commitment** to:


- **Be present and engaged** in a collaborative, sustained and respectful manner

AMERICA'S 3,069 COUNTIES

About 50% of the U.S. population lives in 140 large urban counties, with the remaining 50% residing in more than 2,900 counties. Yet, federal and state mandates for county governments tend to be the same, regardless of population and scale. And all counties share the same purpose of promoting healthy, safe and vibrant local communities across America.
