

 - Attend our annual business meeting.




NACo is a vehicle through which all counties can be heard in Washington, D.C. Members have many opportunities to influence national policy:

RESOLUTION FORMAT:

- 1. **Issue** statement: state the purpose of the resolution
- 2. **Proposed Policy** section: specify a position or action by NACo
- 3. **Background** section: outline the county interest in the issue
- 4. **Fiscal/Urban/Rural Impact** section: address impact for counties in these areas








COUNTIES MATTER
