Wild Horse and Burro Program

Wild Free-Roaming Horses and Burros Act, 1971

- Protect and manage wild horses and burros "as components of pubic lands"
- Maintain a "thriving natural ecological balance"

Federal Land Policy and Management Act, 1976

- Established BLM "multiple-use" mission
- Allowed for motorized vehicles for wild horse management

Public Rangelands Improvement Act, 1978

- Maintain appropriate management level
- Institute adoption program
- Destroy animals with no adoption demand

Other pertinent legislation

- National Environmental Policy Act, 1970
- Appropriations Act, 2005 (Burns Amendment)

Wild Horse and Burro Program

Program goals:

- Healthy wild horses and burros on healthy public rangelands
- Protect health and welfare of animals and the public lands
- Care for and place excess animals into good homes







Wild Horse and Burro Program

- Overpopulation at record level since 1971
- BLM nearly tripled removals in FY18 over previous years and plans for 9,000 in FY19, though more needs to be done
- On-range pop exceeds AML by >60,000 animals
- Off-range pop continues to cost taxpayers \$50 million annually – 2/3 of budget for WHB Program



Wild Horse and Burro Program

- New Online Corral website offers a better way to adopt or purchase online with video capabilities
- >540 animals adopted through the Adoption Incentive Program, which offers up to \$1,000 to adopt an untrained animal
- BLM-supported research is improving effectiveness of fertility control vaccines, such as Gonacon
- BLM will soon request information to help develop protocols for humane sterilization, as directed by Congress



Wild Horse and Burro Program

U.S. Department of the Interior Bureau of Land Management

- BLM is reviewing proposals for additional pasture space for cost-effective long-term care of unadopted animals
- BLM will release a new solicitation in May 2019 for additional corral space to support gather intake and adoptions
- BLM is working closely with partners and stakeholders, including reviewing a proposed strategy developed and supported by an unprecedented coalition of wild horse, wildlife and livestock advocates
- BLM is developing further analysis at the request of Congress
