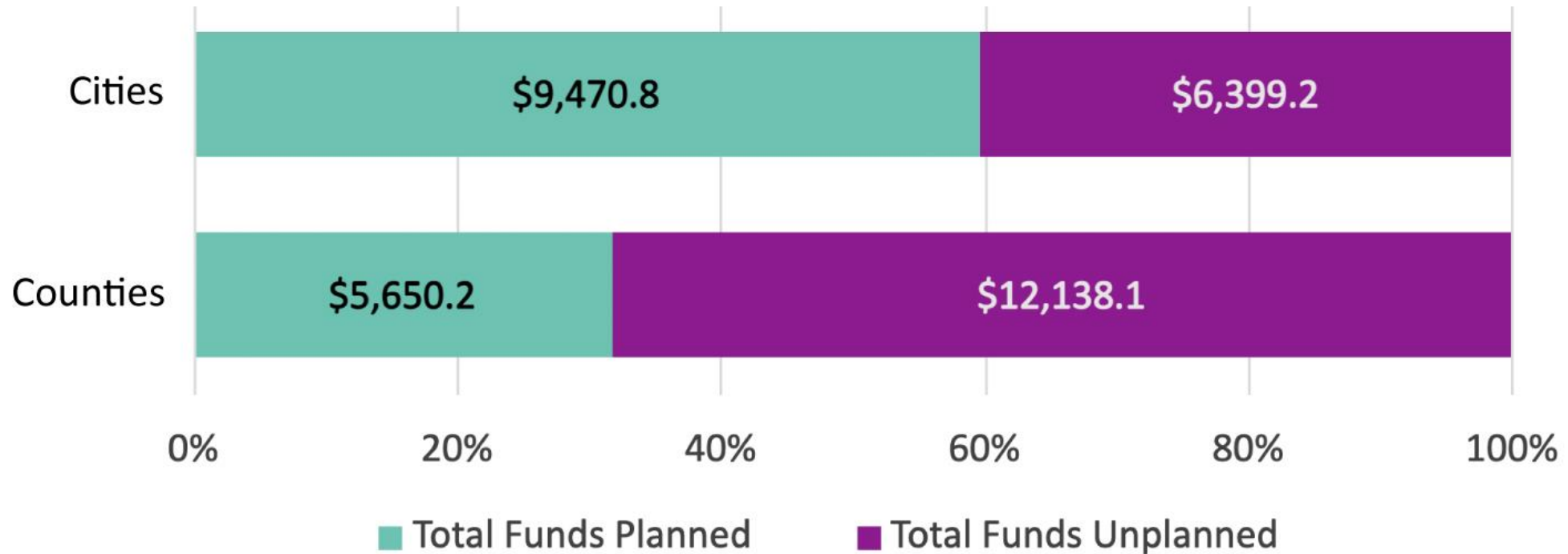

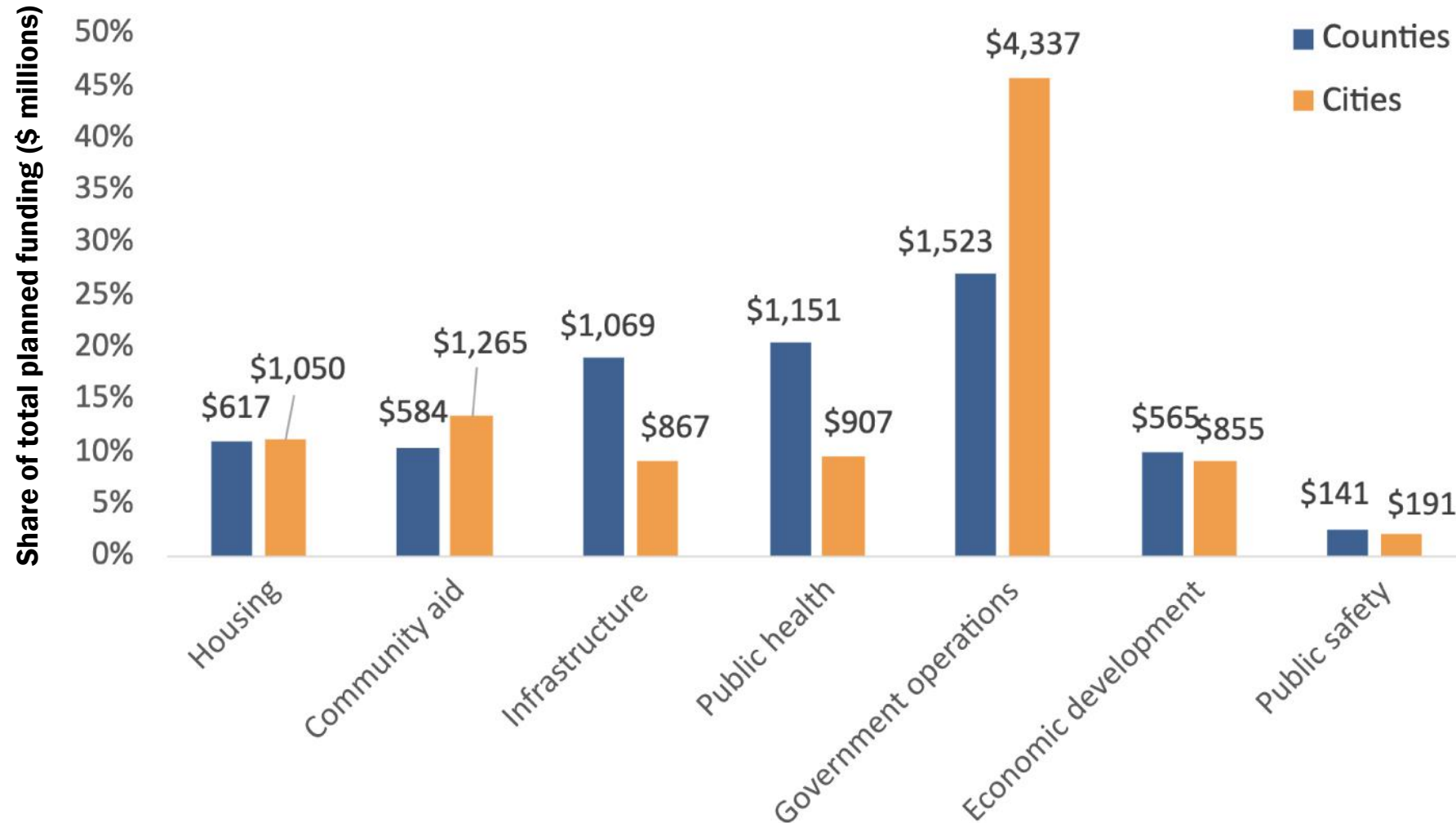

- Eligible activities include expanding early childhood education, addressing educational disparities and direct assistance to impacted households
- Funded from \$7.2 million in Recovery Funds
