




Beneficiary is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) providing health care to underserved residents of McLennan and Bell counties.

Waco Family Medicine

- 1. Far outstretched space due to growth in:
 - A. Residency program National ranking: top 2%
 - B. Number of health professional training programs
 - C. Patient population at WFM-Central
 - D. Complexity of primary care, including number of health programs serving those in poverty
- 2. Current building unable to be expanded/renovated to meet needs
- 3. Current clinics are not ADA compliant and unable to be modified
- 4. Coronavirus pandemic: new needs due to uncertainty about duration, new variants, and recognized potential for future respiratory public health crises

Waco Family Medicine Patient Profiles



73% of the system's patients live at or below 200% of the federal poverty level.

Internal research has shown that 80% of their patients suffer from a comorbid psychiatric diagnosis.

Only site in McLennan County offering robust opioid use disorder (OUD) treatment for those with limited access to healthcare.

Waco Family Medicine Campus – COVID Response

- Pandemic Operational Needs COVID-19
 Mitigation Measures
- The Ability to Respond to COVID-19 Health Emergency
- The Ability to Safely Serve the Underserved and Most Vulnerable at an Expanded Level

How McLennan County is partnering with Waco Family Medicine to complete this project:

- Square footage of new building: 143,100
- Cost estimates for the following:
 - **HVAC system**: 15% of construction cost (~\$6,363,600)
 - Expanded spaces for distancing (marketplace, clinic waiting areas on 3rd and 4th floor): 14,400sf waiting and lobby space (~\$4,262,400)
 - Employee social distancing space (breakrooms 2,250sf @~\$657,000; outdoor break space 4,000sf @~\$296,000; employee health rooms 200sf @~\$58,400; conference center 3,600sf @~\$1,065,600)
 - Expanded spaces for mental health operations (the HBMH designated area 500sf @~\$148,000)

How McLennan County is partnering with Waco Family Medicine to complete this project:

- Increased volume of public spaces (marketplace, patient waiting, conference center that flexes to population care)
- Flexible outdoor space (curbside pharmacy, curbside clinical evaluation)
- Outdoor employee break space
- Roof top units (RTUs) specified with improved filter efficiency above code minimum - MERVE 14 in lieu of MERV 8 for improved air quality.

How McLennan County is partnering with Waco Family Medicine to complete this project:

- Negative pressurized exam rooms for cross-contamination control. Negative pressure exam rooms are provided with dedicated terminal units and exhaust systems to prevent re-entry of contaminated air into the rooftop unit.
- Plumbing fixtures specified with hands-free operation and designated restroom plumbing fixtures specified without aerators to prevent cross-contamination.
- Outdoor park area for community recreation outdoors instead of indoor environment
- Specifying easily cleanable surface finish materials

Heart of Texas Behavioral Health Network— Crisis Center

Construction of a public mental and behavioral health facility, which will be a one-stop location for multiple mental health services.

Will provide a range of integrated services for people with mental health or psychiatric problems, including medical treatment, mental health referrals, a 16-bed facility for overnight or short-term stays, social services, counseling

and more


